

Pavers Questions

1. "What is "Pave the Way" Campaign?"

This is a way of allowing you to recognize yourself or someone you choose to honor on a custom engraved paver. The pavers will be in a designated location in the church's courtyard.

2. What is a Paver and what size?

An engraved commemorative brick that will last a "Life Time".
There are two sizes 8" X 8" or 4" X 8"

3. What is the Price of the Paver?

The price on the 8" X 8" is \$300.00 and the 4" X 8" is \$150.00.

4. When will this Project start?

June 2018

5. Do I have to be a Member of the Church to purchase a Paver?

No

6. If I purchase more than one paver, will it be located next to each other?

Cannot guarantee that it will be located next to each other

7. How many lines will be on each paver?

The 8" X 8" has a total of 6 lines. However, the inscription is limited to 20 characters per line including spaces and punctuation.

The 4" X 4" has a total of 3 lines. And the inscription is limited to 20 characters per line including spaces and punctuation.

8. How is the engraving process done?

The process involved using a laser to produce hardened glass engraving. This method produces a more attractive, durable and long-lasting product.

9. If I purchase a paver, will it be used to fulfill my pledge commitment?

The Capital Campaign pledge is a sacrificial offering payable over a 7 year period. The pavers are a separate initiative.

10. Can I make weekly payments?

Yes; however, pavers will not be completed until it is PAID IN FULL
